Supply Problems:

Container shipping still seeing some delays/ diversions due to mid Atlantic storms. This has affected consignments of pineapples and bananas. Banana ripeners have less time to ripen stock which is leading to some under-colour for green tip codes where fruit is stubborn

Peppers: Supply is very tight for Spanish origin but contracted volumes are currently being met. Early frosts have damaged the first flowers in Dutch crops meaning volumes will be lower this year at seasonal change over so we may see a shortages or gaps around March / April
